SR144 Traffic Changes Begin in May

The bridge over White River on State Road 144 will be restricted to one-way traffic beginning on about May 6. East and westbound traffic will utilize a portable signal which will be on a 4 minute and 15 second loop as traffic crosses the 1200 foot bridge. The roadway will be restricted to 14 feet and three inches wide. Restrictions are anticipated to last through late November, [according to INDOT](#).

News Briefs

SUN Bucks Summer Food Funding: A new summer program called SUN Bucks will provide USDA funding for summer food for families whose household income is less than 185% of the Federal poverty level (\$55,500 for a family of 4, [see full chart](#)). Qualifying families receive funds via an electronic bank card that can be used to buy food at grocery stores. Those whose children are not already on free/reduced meals but fall into the guidelines should complete the Mooresville Schools Free/Reduced Meal application via [Skyward Family Access](#) or request an application from their school office. Please complete the application by the end of April to be included in the early release of the funding. Contact Mooresville Schools Food Services at 317-831-9200 with any questions.



Optional Student Accident Insurance: Mooresville Consolidated School Corporation is insured through Liberty Mutual Insurance.
