

#### Trick or Treat, OctoBoo! at MHS



## Mooresville Consolidated School Corporation School Delay and Closing Information 2019-2020

Dear Mooresville Families,

Indiana weather can be unpredictable throughout the school year and parents are advised to work out a "back-up plan" when school is delayed or cancelled. What should your child(ren) do if school is dismissed early due to worsening weather conditions? Where should they go? Will they have a way to get in the house? Who should they call once they get home, or to a neighbor's house, etc? These questions are helpful as you put your plan together.

State law requires that schools be in session for 180 days. When there is an unscheduled school closing, the school day must be made up. This year, we will have eLearning days for students if school is missed. Online assignments will be posted with teacher and technology help available that morning. Students will have five school days to complete work. Extra time will be available in school computer labs before and after school during those five days. Should more than three closure days take place in a row, days may be added to the school calendar.

School officials make decisions about school closings based on weather information, directly checking road conditions, communicating with highway departments, police agencies, and neighboring school systems. School closings will be announced as early as possible, but it is not always feasible to predict if a closing or delay is needed the night before.

When it is necessary to close or delay school, a message will be sent via our Skylert system to all student households. Please update phone numbers and email addresses in Skyward and at your child's school. <u>Calls will be made prior to 6:00 a.m.</u> Local radio and television stations are also contacted before 6:00 a.m., unless conditions are rapidly changing. #### When school is delayed two hours:

- 1. High school and middle school will begin at 9:50; Newby and Northwood Elementary schools will begin at 10:55; Neil Armstrong and North Madison Elementary schools will begin at 11:00; Waverly Elementary will begin at 11:05.
- 2. Elementary Before and After School Care Program: If school has a morning delay, the program will open at regular hours. If school closes early, the afternoon program will not be in session. If school is closed, the program will not be in session.
- 3. Bus pick-up times will be approximately two hours later than usual.
- 4. If conditions worsen during a delay, school may close.
- 5. AM Developmental Pre-School session is from 10:30 A.M. 12:30 P.M.
- 6. PM Developmental Pre-School session is from 1:30 P.M. 3:30 P.M.
- 7. For MHS students who attend the Area 31 Career Center, if either Mooresville or Wayne Township schools are closed, they will not attend Area 31 programming. If there is a 2-hour delay at either school district, morning transfer students do not attend Area 31 and afternoon students report at their regularly scheduled time.
