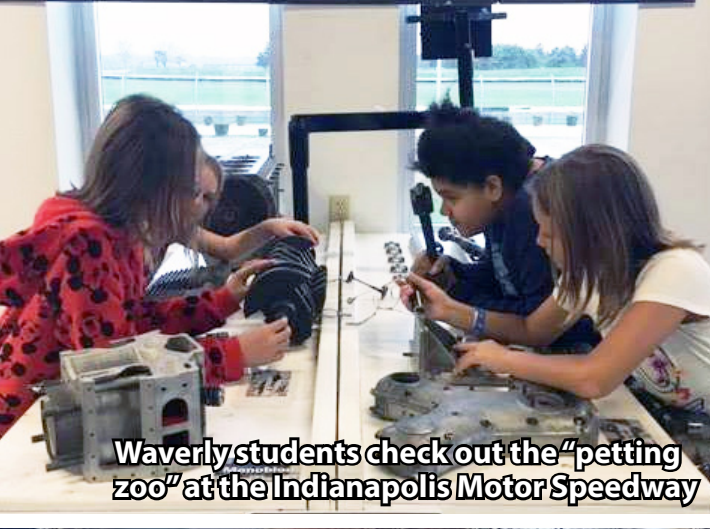

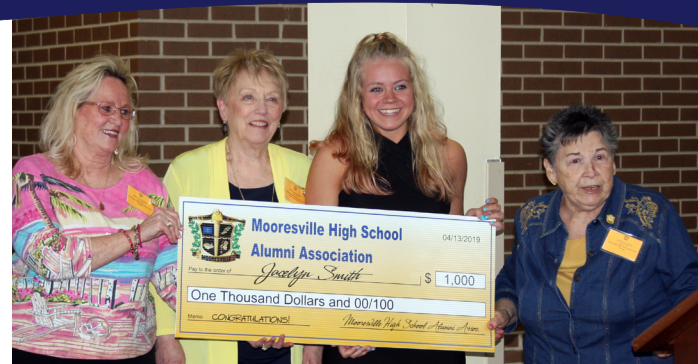

Swisher Honored as Alumnus of the Year



Alumni from several generations of Mooresville High School graduates gather at Friday's 54th annual Alumni Banquet. MHS Alumni Board President Stephanie Heald Parks, '80, welcomed the crowd, with class years from 1935 through 2013 represented.



The highlight of the evening was the announcement of this year's Alumnus of the Year, Charles "Bud" Swisher. Swisher's achievements include serving as President and CEO of Kendrick Memorial Hospital from 1979 to 2000, managing the facility from a negative net worth to a positive net worth of \$23 million by the end of his tenure. After that, he negotiated the sale of the hospital to the Franciscan Health, creating the Kendrick Foundation to assist health-related programs benefiting residents of Morgan County. Swisher has also served on several local boards including the Mooresville and Martinsville Chambers of Commerce, and Mooresville School Board. "We're all called to service," Swisher told the crowd, "...it's not what you accomplish, it's what you do with what you've been given, so I am very grateful."

MHS senior Jacelyn Smith was honored as the MHS Alumni Scholarship recipient. The Alumni Scholarship is given to an MHS student who is the descendant of an MHS alumnus. Jacelyn is the daughter of MHS alumni Duran and Dalena Smith. The oldest alumnus present was John Russell Lambert, a member of the Class of 1935. At 102, Lambert is the oldest known living Mooresville alumnus. Four new members were added to the MHS Wall of Success including: Carrie Bantley Fisher, '80; William "Bill" Swinney, '58; Raymond House, '32; and Henry House, '16.

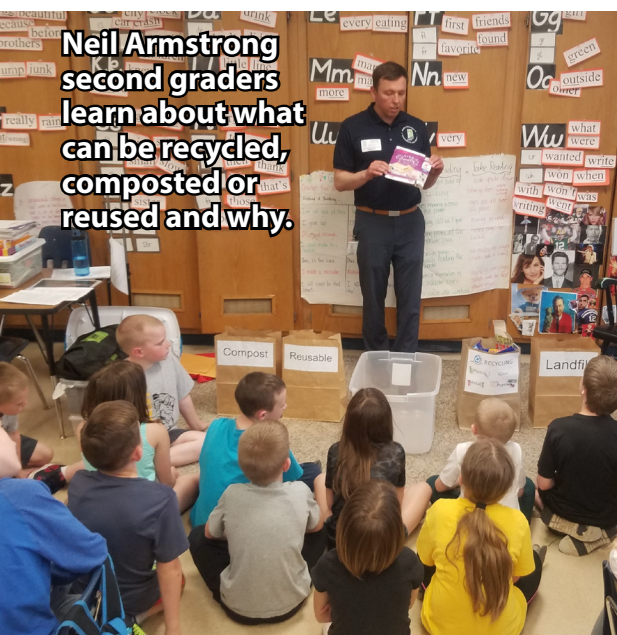
