Mooresville to Implement e-Learning Days

The Mooresville Schools Board of Trustees voted at their meeting Tuesday to add the option of e-Learning Days to the 2019-2020 school year. This proposal will not change the school year calendar, but adds the option of utilizing e-Learning instead of making up instructional days at the end of the school year.

"Adding make-up days at the end of the school year is really not conducive to learning," said Holly Frye, Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction. "We want students to continue to be engaged throughout the year and not lose blocks of time due to weather conditions."

With e-Learning days, students will have a 5-business day window to complete assignments from the start of the day off school. This allows time to complete assignments in open lab time after school or additional time at home, which is helpful when weather conditions create power outages.

The Indiana Department of Education requires that e-Learning instruction falls in line with wherever the students are in their studies. The assignments are the actual practice of the curriculum currently being learned. While Mooresville has one-to-one devices for all students K-12, the devices for the elementary grades stay at school. Those students who do not have a personal device at home can utilize school computer labs after school if they need assistance.

Some districts schedule e-Learning days during the school year for staff training. Mooresville does not have scheduled teacher training days this year but it is a possibility for the future.

The district is looking at options so teachers and technology staff will be available during certain hours on e-Learning days via email or the school Canvas system to help with student or parent questions.

Schools," said Superintendent Randy Taylor. "We know that she'll continue to do great things as an administrator."

The split position is a new one for Mooresville Schools. The two elementary schools have more than 540 students each.

Moore has been with Mooresville Schools for 16 years, serving most recently as a second grade teacher at North Madison.

"I'm excited to be continuing my journey at North Madison while also starting a new chapter by joining the Neil Armstrong team," said Moore. "Mooresville teachers and administrators are focused on doing what's best for our students and I'm honored to be a part of that mission."

Moore, an MHS alumnus, was named Mooresville's Teacher of the Year in 2014. She earned her Bachelor's Degree from Franklin College and her Master's Degree from Western Governor's University. Moore is also a Teach Plus Policy Fellow, who has served on state and federal committees advocating for students. She will assume her assistant principal duties immediately.

Moore and her husband Ryan have two children, son Ethan and daughter Halle.

VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS

All students entering kindergarten, 6th, and 12th grade are due for vaccination boosters (see requirements). The school vaccination deadline is Sept. 2. 


