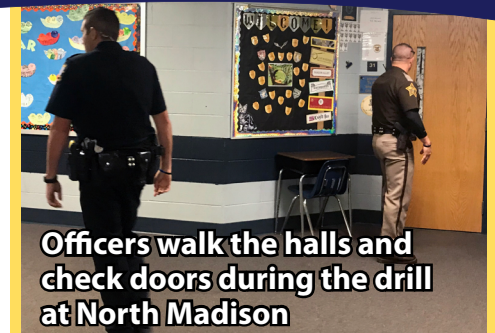
MHS Earns National Recognition from Special Olympics

Mooreville High School has been honored as a national Unified Champion School by Special Olympics for their efforts to engage students with and without special needs in inclusive activities. Schools receiving this honor have met 10 national standards of excellence from Special Olympics and the academic community. Mooreville and 13 other schools from Indiana will now vie to be named part of the "ESPN Honor Roll" of the top inclusive schools in the nation.

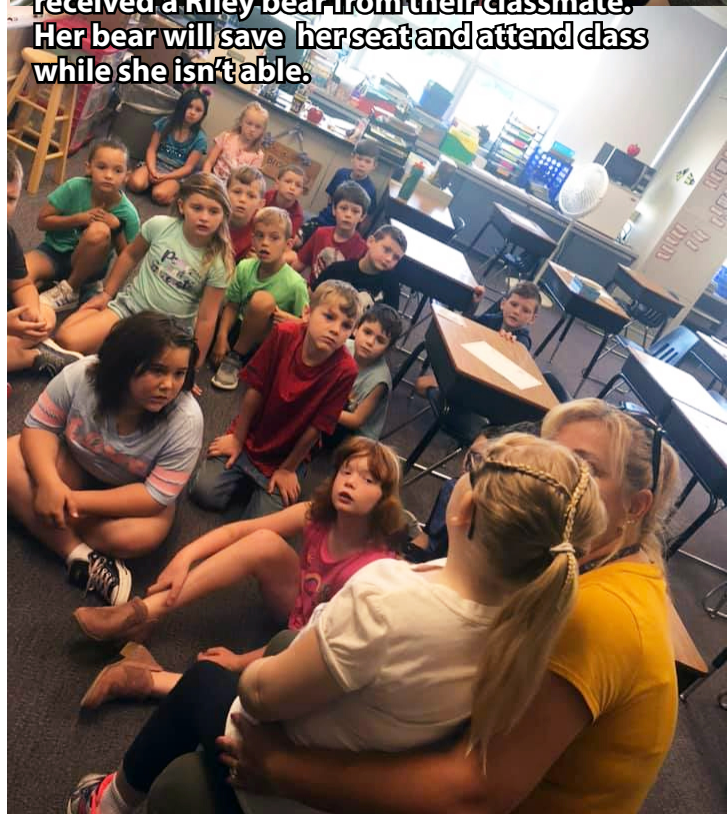

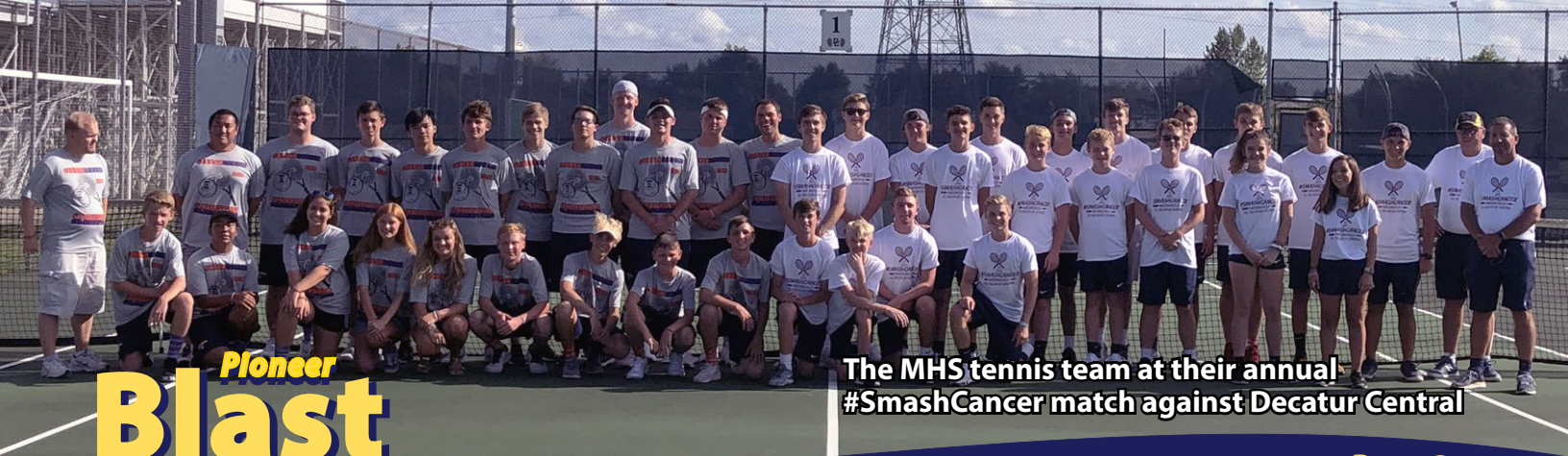
